Direction necessary to remove or reduce the likelihood of the anti-social behaviour, crime or disorder DETAILS Must specify the area to which it relates and can determine the time and the route to leave by Can confiscate any item that could be used to commit anti-social behaviour, crime or disorder

Reform of anti-social behaviour powers Japanese Knotweed ...

The Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 does not explicitly refer to Japanese knotweed or other, similar invasive non-native plants, as the new anti-social behaviour powers are intended to be flexible However, frontline professionals can stop or prevent any behaviour that meets the legal test in the powers
