Employment tribunal fees

Employment tribunal fees were introduced during July 2013 by the Employment Tribunals and the Employment Appeal Tribunal Fees Order 2013 (SI 2013/1893) Prior to that, since the creation of the employment tribunal system, claimants were not required to pay fees to bring their claims Under the Order, claimants had to pay separate fees to issue
